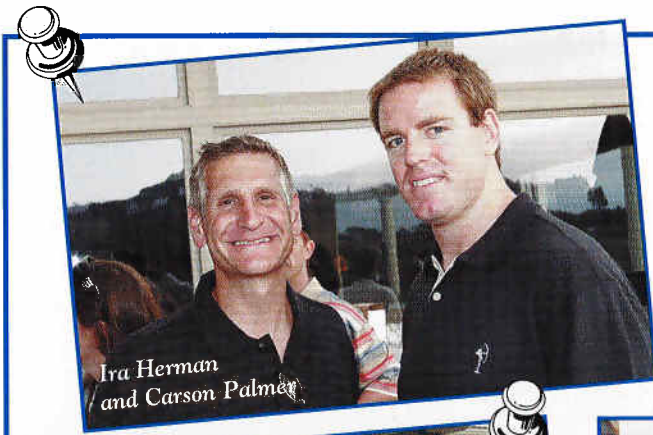


Carson Palmer Golf Tournament ...

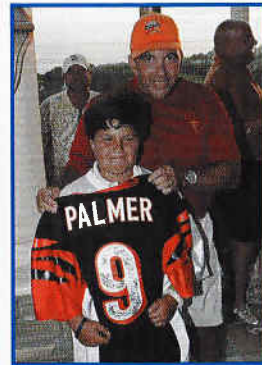

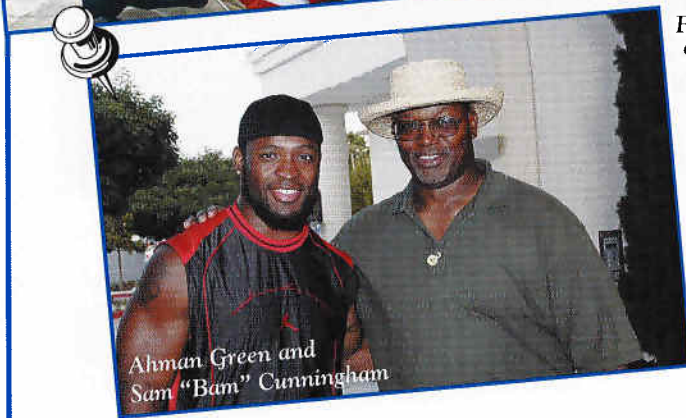
